Joint Programming is a research and innovation policy concept driven by societal challenges. Its aim is to tackle grand societal challenges through more efficient use of resources, by the alignment of funding at national level and through decreasing fragmentation in the European Research Area (ERA). There are currently over sixty active ERA-NET Actions (around 250 have been funded in total since FP6), five Article 185 initiatives, ten Joint Programming Initiatives (JPIs), and six European Joint Programme Cofunds (EJPs). While H2020 funded actions will phase out, HEU Partnerships are being developed by the EC and the Member States. For an overview see our website jointprogramming.nl. The joint programming officers at Wageningen University & Research follow ERA policy and strategy, the JPIs, EJPs, Art. 185, ERA-NET Actions, and the new HEU Partnerships with a focus on those in the areas of the bioeconomy, food, and the blue and green environment. We have built collaborations with many other joint programming actors in national and European networks, such as through the Platform of Bioeconomy ERA-NET Actions, the support action for the Standing Committee on Agricultural Research SCAR and national JPI forum and sounding boards. We are involved in coordination and management of FACCE-JPI as a Secretariat Member, in the ERA-NET Actions FOSC and ERA-GAS as Executive Team members, and in the EJP SOIL. We also conduct a global science and policy mapping on microbiome research in frame of the International Bioeconomy Forum, and are involved in work on Responsible Research and Innovation (RRI), scoping emerging research areas, preparing R&I agendas and monitoring, evaluation and impact assessment in joint programming networks. Editorial: Lessons for the future

Summer Holidays have passed, and even in a pandemic, people resume to their regular working routines. However, regular has taken on a new meaning in 2020. As the Covid-19 issue is far from over, many countries are preparing for what may happen, come Autumn. For a lot of people the 'normal' routine now means much more working from home and interactive digital meetings instead of physical travelling. A recent Dutch survey hinted at the possibility these changes may last beyond the Covid-19 crisis. That raises an interesting, and maybe hopeful, point with regard to how to tackle some of the current societal challenges.

This years' Earth Overshoot Day fell on the 22nd of August. Earth Overshoot Day marks the date when humanity's demand for ecological resources and services in a given year exceeds what Earth can regenerate in that year. The grim news is, that with our current use of resources and accumulation of waste, we still need 1.6 Earths. Interesting though: that this years' date fell almost one month later than in 2019, at a date that hasn't occurred since 2005. It seems quite safe to suppose the late date is directly linked to the changes in our behaviour, so far, this year.

Within a couple of weeks, the European Commission is organising the European Research and Innovation Days again. Held from the 22nd until the 24th of September, this year the focus will be on presenting the recommendations from the Mission Boards. Together with the new Partnerships that are currently in different stages of development, these Missions are envisioned as a commitment to solve major societal challenges like fighting cancer, adapting to climate change, protecting our oceans, living in greener cities and ensuring soil health and food. The Missions are designed to go beyond research and innovation, and ought to spark innovation across sectors, and appeal to European citizens. Everyone can have a say on the missions for the upcoming weeks, and deliver 'grassroots' input. Ultimately the Missions, together with the new Partnerships, should play a crucial role in achieving European Union' priorities such as the European Green Deal.

At a global level they need to contribute to meeting the Sustainable Development Goals, and as such, to a later Earth Overshoot Day. A quick look at the individual European countries, shows most have their Overshoot Day long before August. So there is literally a world to win in the European Union. And while I hope to get back to the 'old way of life', I also hope to take some new ideas and practices forward in the years to come. It *is* possible to cut down drastically on international physical meetings. It *is* possible to work more from home. It *is* possible to change the way we always did things before.

Let's keep these benefits. Any maybe we can use the lessons we learn now, to change the future.

New research on ecosystem restoration

The BiodivERsA network and the Joint Programming Initiative on Water, have announced a new joint call for research, titled: "Conservation and restoration of degraded ecosystems and their biodiversity, including a focus on aquatic systems". At this stage, 28 countries, including the Netherlands, have expressed interest for an amount of over EUR 18 million. Expected call launch is October 5th, with a pre-proposal closing date on December 7th.

New research on sustainable and organic food systems

In July, the ERA-NET Cofunds CORE Organic and SUSFOOD2 published the results of the joint transnational Call 'Towards sustainable and organic food systems' launched in 2019. The 21 funding bodies from 18 countries/regions are committing around 9.5M EUR for transnational research. Twelve projects, under three topic themes were selected for funding.

JPI Oceans' microplastics research projects brochure available

The six projects that have started under the 'Microplastics in the marine environment' call of the Joint Programming Initiative for Healthy and Productive Seas and Oceans, are now presenting themselves in a project brochure. The call was a joint transnational research action that brought together thirteen JPI Oceans member countries, Latvia and Brazil to support research with a budget of approximately EUR 10.5 million.
